A number of veterans living in our community are living in very difficult circumstances due to a variety of reasons, some of which are financial and emotional issues. They have the same needs as those who receive benefits from the Amen Pantry: canned and dry goods, toilet paper, and all manner of hygiene items. The students are allowed to come in and help stock shelves as well as create encouraging cards and notes for the veterans. Our first visit was yesterday. When we arrived there were only about three food items on the shelves. The items we took made a big difference for the veterans that were scheduled to come shopping later that day. 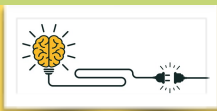

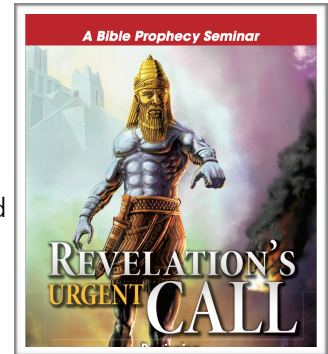
