## City of Dickinson

Grades 3-8 spent Wednesday morning on the town. We started with a tour at the Dickinson Public Safety Center. Lieutenant Kylan Klauser gave us a tour all over the police side of the facility. This facility was new in 2015, and he said they have already grown to the point where they need to expand the facility. He showed us the interrogation rooms, a training/simulation room where they do UR-type training, the $\mathrm{lab} / f$ forensic testing room where they work to solve crimes, and a room where the officers on duty meet to discuss current situations they need to handle. One of the favorite parts of the tour was when we went out into the garage and saw the armored vehicles and got to meet a K-9 member of the force named Norman. His handler demonstrated how Norman can sniff out drugs. When he locates some, he immediately sits and won't be moved from that spot. It was very impressive. There are two K-9 cops in Dickinson, and they live with their handlers.
One of the head firefighters, Mr. Banyaj, gave us a tour of the firefighters' side of the facility. It's like a dormitory because the officers are on duty for 48 hours at a time, so they eat, sleep, work and hang out there like a family during those days.
From there, we went to City Hall. Rita Binstock led us through the building and we got to meet MANY city workers in their offices where they each briefly explained what they do to help our city run smoothly. The mayor even interrupted his meeting with the commissioners and other city officers to meet us and take a picture with us (photo on the front with the man in the pink shirt). We enjoyed the positive and friendly people we encountered everywhere we went on the tour.
