#### Visit from Oreo

Last Thursday, Connie Reitan, a representative from Service Dogs for America, came to visit the school. The third graders recently read a book about the first seeing eye dog, so we contacted this organization in Jud, ND to see about getting someone to visit and teach us. Ms. Reitan brought an 82-pound lab named Oreo who is currently being trained, not as a seeing eye dog, but as a service dog who will one day assist someone suffering from post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). The students and staff enjoyed watching Oreo respond to various commands. One thing demonstrated which was very interesting was when Ms. Reitan pretended she was having a panic attack. Oreo had been resting on his blanket and when he heard the distress sounds coming from her, he immediately hopped up and put his paws on her shoulders to offer comfort. Ms. Reitan showed how to use a clicker to quickly teach Oreo a new trick. Other service dogs available are mobility assistance dogs, seizure response/medical response dogs, and dia-



betic alert dogs. This organization is currently using inmates at two correctional facilities in the state to help train and socialize the dogs—a benefit to both dogs and inmates. The newest program (still upcoming) is going to provide service dogs to be placed in courthouses to provide comfort and security for vulnerable individuals testifying at trials.
