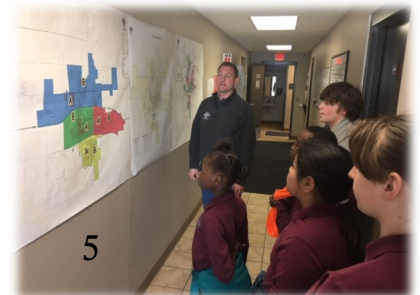
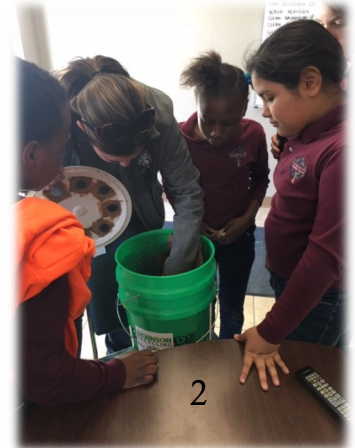


## Dickinson Waste Management Field Trip

It was a very interesting visit that the upper graders had to see how the city of Dickinson handles its waste. We learned that the Dickinson plant handles waste from a large area of southwest North Dakota (from the South Dakota border to Killdeer, from Montana border to Glen Ulin)! Our tour guide, Aaron, has been working at and now managing this plant for twenty years. He showed us how the city is divided into four zones for garbage collection (Picture 5). The recent addition of a recycling program in the Dickinson area came with a price tag of \$1,000,000! Picture 4 shows the building where our recycling materials are left by the trucks that pick up recycling from the blue curbside carts. The trucks come in and dump everything in this large room. Then a tractor pushes the material onto a conveyor belt which carries it up into a compactor where it is formed into bales or compacted into a trailer. All Dickinson area recyclables are transported to Minnesota for sorting and re-purposing. Pictures 1 and 3 show the students at the landfill. This landfill was begun in the 1990s. The hole is HUGE! Under the ground where we were standing is layers of trash from years past. Picture 2 shows Miss Rachel and her composting bucket. In it are plant materials and wiggly red worms (a.k.a. composting worms). She said that a large portion of the waste that ends up in landfills is compostable. Those in the waste management industry encourage everyone to do their part to reduce waste: Recycle! Compost! Use fewer pre-packaged foods!

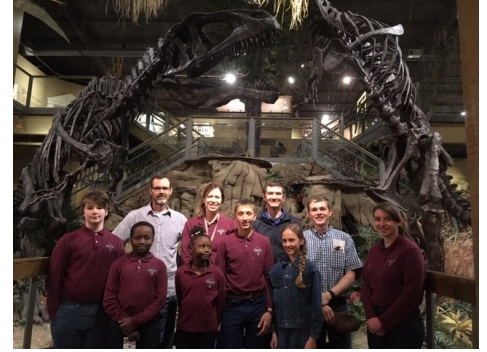
## 8th Grade Graduation

## Picnic & Softball Game

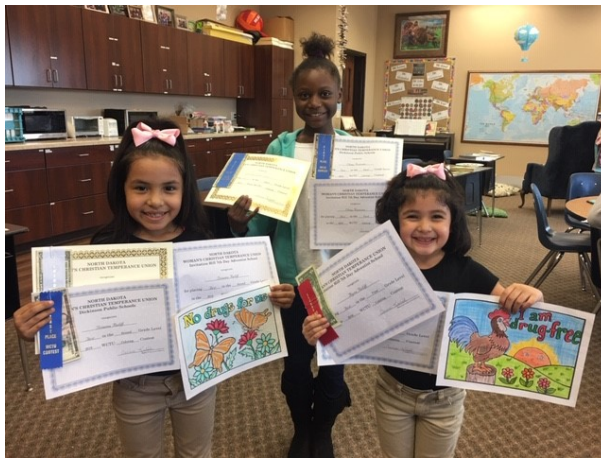

## Coloring Contest Winners

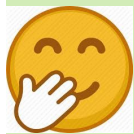
