Additional Information: I have lots of energy and that's all.

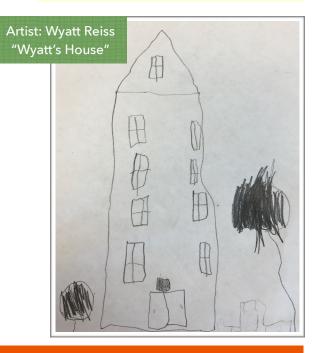
