Visit with an Author

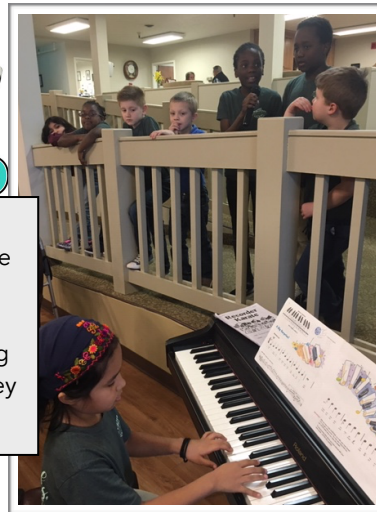
